Animals are always a welcome distraction, and while you can't pet the goats at Fairview, outside Paarl, the curious sight of them climbing the estate's iconic goat tower should keep younger guests entertained whilst adults enjoy the well-organised tastings indoors.

Vergenoegd Wine Estate relies on feathered diversions to add some distraction. Its large flocks of Indian Runner ducks are in charge of keeping the vineyards snail-free but also do a sterling job of delighting visitors young and old. Happily, the estate's Runner Duck Red blend is as quaffable as the ducks are entertaining.

Warwick Wine Estate is famous for its wide lawns and stylish picnics, but even when the restaurant moves indoors for winter the large jungle gyms and plenty of space make it a fine choice for tasting with the kids in tow. The historic manor house offers a menu of warming winter dishes along with a small kids' menu.
